In partnership with the 5th Precinct, we have targeted specific areas on Harvard, Bishop, Yorkshire and Grayton as we cover the entire area. We are celebrating our 12th anniversary of reinstating our contracted security patrol. The program continues to be a success as a deterrent as much as possible. Many neighborhoods no longer have this added security benefit. Thank you to the residents for showing support in so many ways – payments, volunteer time and/or keep-

ing a watchful eye out for your neighbor – all of this has a positive dollar value and promotes solid outcomes. As neighbors we appreciate the effort and time put forth in keeping us a “neighborhood of choice.”

East English Village will be a test neighborhood, along with Bagley neighborhood on the west side, for rental inspection and ownership compliance with regard to code and rental requirements. The program will cover all rental properties in EEV, including two-family owner-occupied and single rental properties. Please note: if you are doing renovations that require a city permit,



Alger Theater meets funding goal – huge success!

The Alger Theater Patronicity Campaign concluded with great results. The campaign goal was to raise \$25,000 toward building a community rooftop deck and to purchase new A/V equipment for use inside the Alger. The open air patio will be available for individuals or groups to host meetings or events, hear live music or simply to gather. The first public space of its kind on East Warren, the rooftop will help anchor the neighborhood by making it a welcoming environment for residents and visitors.

A commitment of matching funds from the Michigan Economic Growth



Corporation was given at the start of the campaign – provided the Alger reached its goal of \$25,000. In addition to the match from MEGC, a bonus match from "Watchman Ink" for all contributions received between Septem-

ber 28 and the end of the campaign, was provided. Final Count = 260 campaign donors for a grand total of \$52,352! The Alger Theater expresses sincere thanks to all who generously donated to this community project.

Think like a dog and yours will be happy



Responsibilities of Elected EEV Board Positions

Here's what each position does for East English Village.

PRESIDENT

- * Prepare agendas and conduct General Meetings and Board Meetings
- * Appoint committees and monitor, or delegate the monitoring of, the principal activities of these committees
- * Attend, or appoint a representative to attend, meetings of other neighborhood organizations and business associations as a representative of EEV
- * Arrange for speakers for the General Meetings
- * Report monthly at the General Meeting of the activities he/she has conducted or attended on behalf of the Association since the time of the previous report.

1ST VICE PRESIDENT

- * Perform all duties of the president in his/her absence.
- * Attend General Meetings and Operations Council meetings
- * Monitor committee activities as requested by the president
- * Assist the president in the scheduling of speakers for the General Meetings.

2ND VICE PRESIDENT

- * Perform all duties of the 1st Vice President in his/her absence.
- * Maintain all records of the Association except the financial accounts
- * Maintain the records of the Board and Block Captain network
- * Maintain list of occasional volunteers

TREASURER

- * Maintain the financial records of the Association
- * Collect and dispense the Association's funds
- * Report on the finances of the Association at the General Meetings and Board meetings.
- * Arrange for an annual audit of the financial accounts
- * Arrange with a local bank to deposit the Association's funds and maintain a checking account for the transaction of the association's business
- * Disburse the Association's funds as approved by the Board

RECORDING SECRETARY

- * Record the minutes of each Board meeting
- * Provide the previous meeting minutes at each meeting
- * Maintain such records as are requested by the President and/or the Board Meeting
- * Pick up, or arrange to have collected, the Association's mail at the Post Office box at least on a weekly basis

STREET REPRESENTATIVES

- * Assure that each block on the street he/she represents has a block captain
- * Coordinate projects with the block captains as necessary
- * Any other duties deemed necessary by the Board


