President's Message


Happy February!

EEV sponsors Tax Foreclosure Prevention Workshop

On Saturday, January 30, a Tax Foreclosure Prevention Workshop was held at St. Matthew Church. EEV residents Steve Babson and Nancy Brigham spearheaded and organized the event. Staff members from United Community Housing Coalition & Michigan Legal Services, as well as trained representatives from the EEV, Morningside and Cornerstone neighborhoods, were on hand to assist in the intricate process. Fifty-nine homeowners received individual counseling services and advice toward structuring a plan to save their home from tax foreclosure. A sincere thank you to Father Duane Novelly, Pastor, for providing generous space at St. Matthew Church and to the many EEV volunteers who assisted with mailings, logistical set-up, security, registration, intake and various tasks during the Workshop. We are hopeful and confident that many of the at-risk homes identified within the three communities will be saved

resulting in a positive outcome for all three communities. Comments from participants leaving the Workshop, which concluded at 4:30 PM, were very

positive. Many expressed appreciation at having this opportunity offered right in their own neighborhood!

Pet corner

Resuscitation for dog emergencies

Greetings all!
 Hope you are managing this 2015-16 winter weather well. We have been extremely blessed and thankful to have had such a mild winter and to have escaped the blizzard that recently hit the Atlantic Coast. Even so, we have experienced frigid weather than can be fatal to dogs if left outside without adequate protection. Remember, your four-legged friends need food, water, protection, attention, exercise and LOVE! They, too, are family.

Now, in the unfortunate event your dog has stopped breathing, let's talk about Dog First Aid. The quickest and simplest way to see if your dog has

stopped breathing, hold a mirror in front of his mouth. If the mirror fogs up, he is breathing. You can also lay him on his side and place your hand on his chest to see if it is moving up and down. IF NOT, check his mouth and throat for foreign objects. If still not breathing:

1. Place your mouth over the entire snout and slowly exhale till you see his chest rise.
2. Give 4 or 5 quick breaths – then check to see if he has started breathing on his own. Continue process.
3. If still not breathing, check with your Veterinarian on how to do chest compressions. You can also give the dog's chest


