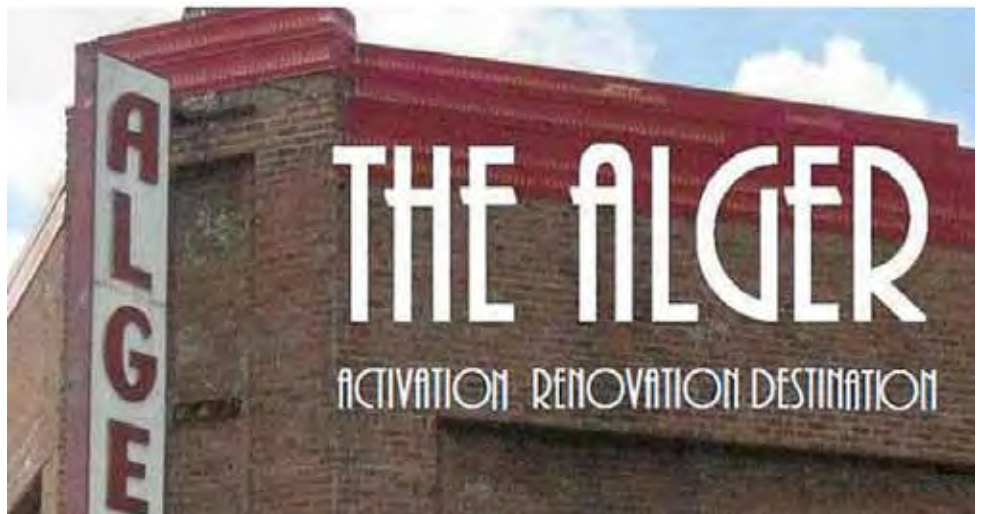

Precautions in case a pet gets lost

Greetings EEV pet owners & animal lovers!

It's time to get back to something near and dear to my heart. We all profess to love our animals and are distraught if they become lost. Recently we have had a rash of lost (and found) dogs. I wonder why these animals that we claim to love so dearly have no collars, have collars without I.D.s or are not microchipped. It is so easy for a lost pet to become stressed and confused. Also the awful fear of being lost can cause panic to the extreme point of not even recognizing familiar sights and smells and even causing a disregard to the dangers of traffic.

Collars and tags are affordable to almost everyone. Micro chips are more expensive, but can be obtained at ALL ABOUT



ANIMALS in Warren for \$25. Their phone is (586) 879-1745.

Did you know that there have even been occasions when a chipped animal has been found in another state months or years after the animal has disappeared? The critical issue to remember if you have chipped your pet is to keep their "chip registry" up to date. If you move or have a telephone number change, update the registry. That way if there is occasion to let you know that your pet has been located, there will be

If you attended the EEV Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, Feb. 10, you heard the request for volunteer drivers. However, this time the request was made via AmeriCorps, represented by Latisha Davis, for the Citizens Radio Patrol (not EEV Volunteer Patrol). This is directly connected with the Detroit Police Dept.

Applications were available at the meeting. Once the application is completed and turned in, it is submitted to the DPD for approval. Hopefully, you applied, as it is a system through which drivers are in direct radio contact with the DPD during your drive time. Additionally,

drivers receive mileage costs. Ideally, drivers will commit to regular drive times within each month.
