Board Targets Blight in EEV

The East English Village Neighborhood Association is taking blight seriously. We have identified 19 Boarded and Vacant Properties in the neighborhood and 2 Vacant Lots that have been consistent safety and blight issues in the neighborhood. All properties have been vacant for years, boarded or partially boarded and many have blight tickets and past due taxes.

Letters have been sent to the property owners expressing concern, asking them to address the condition of their properties and encouraging improvements or sell the property to someone that will.

Letters have also been sent to the Mayors Office, Councilwomen Johnson's Office, The Department of Neighborhoods, The Detroit Police 5 th Precinct, and the Neighborhood NPO's.

Some good news is that 5950 Yorkshire and adjacent vacant lot 5942 Yorkshire was purchased from the Detroit Land Bank in February 2024 and 5921 Bishop Street was purchased in March 2024. Hopefully the new owners make us proud!

Swingin' at EEV's

SAVOY



Okay, I admit it, I'm not an impartial reviewer. I am excited about this! The restaurant building at 171 E Warren that stood empty for nearly a decade is now full of life. The Savoy restaurant features good food, music and community. Even the parking lot again has a helpful attendant. EEV neighbor Tanya Gazdik told Yelp she's "ecstatic" that the Savoy is open. She praised the food – from the lobster bisque to the Cajun-seasoned catfish with shrimp and lobster. Her co-diner said his strip steak was cooked perfectly. And when the server realized it was his birthday, they got complimentary glasses of Prosecco. They loved the Friday night act, Elevation featuring Chiara. "Her voice is amazing," said Tanya, who vowed she'll "definitely be back."

The National food critic "Hungry Black Man" (a.k.a. Starex Smith) paid a surprise visit, staging a Facebook Live show where he tasted a table full of creative dishes. He rated the Lobster Mac N Cheese as "Very good, a 4.7 out of 5," even though "I'm not a lobster person and I don't usually like pasta." He went on to praise other dishes, including the meatloaf and stuffed button mushrooms, and concluded that "everything here is... very, very good." As for me, my portion of Chilean Seabass Symphony was small, but it was beautifully spiced and cooked. The trout my friend ordered was also delicious but huge enough for two meals (and that's just what it became).

And the music- Wow! I have long been a fan of nationally known bassist Ralphe Armstrong and drummer Gayelynn McKinney. And right from the start, they've been regulars at The Savoy. Savoy owner Jai-Lee Dearing worked with them both at Bert's, down by Eastern Market. Dearing had also owned Rockefeller's Oyster Bar on Mack, before it burned down from a 2016 fire in an upstairs apartment.

That tragedy threw the Oyster Bar's regular "piano man" Marty Ballard out of work, but he kept on playing in east side venues, and he now has a new home at the Savoy. You can find him tickling the ivories at the 4 pm "early bird" seatings each weekend.

The Savoy is not cheap, but given the quality of the food, it's not overpriced either. The main dishes run from \$17 for pizza to \$35 for the priciest seafood. (Dishes on the kids' menu cost just \$9.95.) Chef Don Kruse is a fervent farm-to-table fan, and always offers vegetarian options. Or you could sit at the bar and just have a drink, and maybe an appetizer, while listening to the music or watching TV. You'll find a great variety of wine (priced from from \$8 a glass to \$20) and unique creative cocktails.

The Savoy is rates 4.5 stars in Restaurantji. They are open Tuesday-Saturday 4-10 pm, and Sundays noon-3, and 4-10:00. They are closed on Mondays.

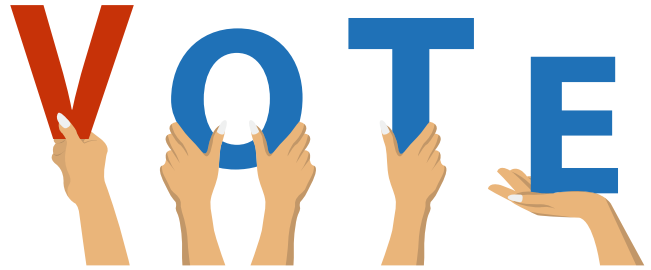

It's Great to be a Block Captain! by Ethan Boyd

As we look to fill vacancies for Block Captains in the East English Village (EEV) neighborhood, I'm reminded of why my wife Bettina and I answered the call eleven years ago.

We arrived in EEV in 1987, during a time of great economic upswing in Detroit, stayed through the down-turn and are now here witnessing one of the greatest comeback stories in our city's history! Our decision to become Block Captains, though, was during

the downturn of our city. We saw how fast people were moving out of our neighborhood and how crime was rising. We were not going anywhere so decided to get active and do something positive. At one of our monthly community meetings, we volunteered as the Block Captains on Harvard Rd, and we are so glad that we did!

The first thing we did was kick off a "get-to-know-your-neighbor campaign". We went door-to-door introducing ourselves to folks, giving them our phone number and email along with the current neighborhood welcome booklet (now called a Resource Guide). It took us a few times going out to meet everyone because of all the conversation and genuine fellowship that began just from that small act.

It wasn't long before we started having Block Parties! The Block Party events have been a lot of fun and a time for the neighbors to get to know one another even better. We believe that our community is stronger when we build those bonds of connection. Connected neighbors are more inclined to look out for each other proactively – a quick call or text enables us to check on each other if we see something 'not quite right' or during a bad storm or other disasters.

The role of block captain has allowed us to learn to work with and influence a truly diverse group of people. We see the importance of appreciating other people's gifts and talents. To let them "get in where they fit in" and make the contribution they were naturally designed to make. After eleven years, we truly understand the impact of the saying, "People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care!" On your job you need good coworkers; in your church you need good parishioners; and on your block you need good neighbors. Being a block captain has helped me become a better neighbor.

EEV is a great community to live in and the Block Captain's role is one of the fundamental building blocks in keeping our community organized and informed. Do you like meeting interesting new people? Are you looking for ways to get a little more involved in the EEV community? We invite you to join us and become a Block Captain. Come out, we would love to meet you too.

Angela Colombo of Yorkshire



Some call me Angie, a nickname that stuck from jewelry making days. My uncle called me Angelina. Friends call me Ang. Whatever you call me, I want to make pasta with you! And lots of other yummy food.

When I'm not assisting chefs at Sur La Table's cooking classes, I'm rehabbing two houses and planning my next cooking class.

Maybe it's in my blood, I love all things food related. I have been working in the food/culinary industry from when I was a wee tot. My parents opened a fruit and vegetable market in Brooklyn, NY in 1966, just before I was born. We lived in the upstairs railroad apartment. Two years later, we moved to Queens, both home and store, and my father continued building the business, a legacy that I carry with me today. Fast forward to me here in Detroit, the connection lives strong within me, I dream of sharing my family's food customs with friends here.



I have a passion for making the food of my childhood. My parents came from Sicily in the 60s and brought a know-how that wasn't present in NYC at the time, according to my mom's stories of searching for ingredients and her amazement of how differently Americans did things. Being at her apron strings all the time, curious and wanting to get involved in the cooking from when I was very little, I picked up a few things.

I moved to Detroit in 2017. The prior year I'd decided my life needed a complete upheaval and what better way to do that than to move 1/3 way cross country? I ended up in East English Village by sheer luck, maybe the angels were looking out for me. And because of one enthusiastic neighbor that happened to be outside, down the street, when I was looking at the house I would eventually buy. That after meeting another lovely neighbor a few blocks away. You could say it seemed the EEVer's were on a mission to convince me that this was the place for me. It didn't take much, I immediately felt the vibe here was right for me.

So far I have hosted a truffle making class and gnocchi making. Next class coming up will be Pasta 101 on May 19. Classes are held locally in EEV, stay tuned to the neighborhood Facebook group for the next location!



New Neighborhood Signage is Coming!

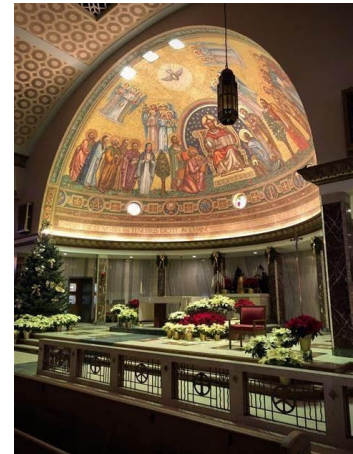

Preserving Our Past: St. Matthew Parish Awarded Historic Designation on National Registry

Detroit is home to many sites, buildings, objects, districts and structures which hold important historic architectural and cultural meaning. The U.S. Department of the Interior is the federal arm of government responsible for setting standards and overseeing the natural resources and history of our country. One major artery to this department is the National Park Service (NPS) which more directly serves the endeavors of historic preservation.

Since its establishment in 1916, NPS has initiated law and agency to give resources to state and local governments for historic resources. Recently, the St. Matthew Parish Campus at the corner of Whittier and Harper was awarded this noteworthy designation. After much research and completion of a detailed application, this positive news was shared with the parishioners and the community.



St. Mathew Church reflects the trends in Detroit church design in the 1950's with regard to the relationship of architecture to worship. The streamlined Romanesque design – using textured materials in place of lavish exterior ornament – was a transition between the traditional European based classicism and the “thin and light” designs of the 1960's and 1970's. Renowned artist, Andrew Magia, created the beautiful stained-glass windows as well as the magnificent 2300 square foot mosaic dome above the altar. This dome “Lord of the Universe” is considered to be one of the largest examples of mosaic art in the United States and is estimated to contain over 1.5 million tiles. The historic designation of the St. Matthew campus is significant to not only the parishioners but to our entire eastside community. This affirms the long legacy of the parish and reflects the unwavering commitment of the St. Matthew Parish to build on its history as a new future unfolds with the construction of “The Residences at St. Matthew” ~ a healthy, affordable housing project. St. Matthew Parish continues to be a “beacon of light and a sign of hope” to all.

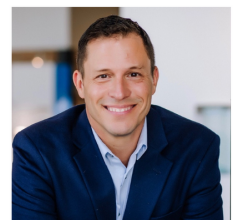
