




beshroomed forms

The next time you head from home toward I-94, you're invited to stop by EEV's new Beshroomed farm and store on Harper Ave at Kensington, and grab a delicious cup of fresh mushroom coffee. So you've never heard of coffee imbued with mushrooms? Here's why you might give it a try.

Farm owner Osotrari Washington and coworker Tim Reed are not just hard-working entrepreneurs, who warmly welcome you into the shop. They are also men with a mission, who believe this is a special food that can improve our well-being.

During the long hours the pair spend at the shop, they cultivate four varieties right there. In a big enclosed area you'll see the controlled environment where the mushroom spores and tissues begin to sprout from oats and other grains. On other shelves the fungi grow to maturity in enclosed containers.

Why mushrooms? They have been around longer than we have, explains Osotrari. The indigenous people who at first collected them for food discovered magical and healing properties. They were so popular as medicine that indigenous people wove symbols of mushrooms into their clothing. And since they're great decomposers in soil, they are good for the environment.

Osotrari grew up in Detroit and then traveled widely, learning and practicing martial arts. While researching ancient cultures he became captivated by the history and benefits of mushrooms. When Tim, who hails from Nebraska, met him at a psychedelic conference in Detroit, Osotrari had been teaching about mushrooms and ancient cultures, that mushrooms belong to a large kingdom of fungi that's not just psychedelic. The pair set out to collaborate on introducing people to the other benefits mushrooms hold.

They believe the varieties that the farm cultivates enhance people's well-being in many ways. Although brewed in coffee (and also hot chocolate), the mushrooms actually promote relaxation. The Turkey Tail variety is known to combat cancer. The Reishi boosts the immune system, and Lion's Mane improves brain function.

The word is getting out. The farm was mentioned on Channel 4, and it was featured in Detroit Eater magazine. And "people are spreading the news by word of mouth and on social media. They do a lot of the talking for us. It makes you feel wonderful," says Tim. "We like to believe mushrooms can help save the world."

In spite of their very long hours at work, "We are living our dreams."





MOBILE APP

Download the DivDat app on your smartphone. Include the period or dash in your parcel number. Pay with eCheck or credit card.*



PHONE

Call (855) 894-2400 to pay with a credit card.*



KIOSK

Find a DivDat kiosk in your neighborhood at www.codkiosk.com. Bring cash, check, or credit card to pay. Include the period or dash in your parcel number.



MAIL

Send check, money order, or cashier's check, along with your payment coupon to:

City of Detroit, Property Tax Department, P.O. Box 33193, Detroit, MI 48232-3193

Payment with the enclosed coupon must be received by the due date to be considered timely.

To ensure your payment is most accurately and efficiently processed, the preferred payment method is online, mobile app, phone, or kiosk. Mail payments should only be used as a last resort.



CITY HALL

Find a payment kiosk at Coleman A. Young Municipal Center (CAYMC) in the DTSC Kiosk Center in Suite #154, in the main lobby, and behind the Spirit of Detroit at the Woodward entrance.

Visit the Detroit Taxpayer Service Center in Suite #130. Monday–Thursday, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; and Friday by phone at (313) 224-3560, 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.

MULTIPLE PROPERTY OWNERS

10 or fewer parcels:

Pay by Check or credit card* at detroitmi.gov/payproptax. Add your properties to your cart and make a single payment.

11 or more parcels:

Pay via ACH/Wire using AutoAgent. It's the easiest way to pay many properties at once! Visit autoagent.com for more information.



Additional fees will be applied to all credit and debit card transactions.



New for the Upcoming 2024 Tax Season!

- As of March 2024, payments mailed to P.O. Box 33193 will be returned and not processed.
- Beginning July 2024, your property tax bills will have a new P.O. Box. Note: Please do not mail property tax payments to the physical building.

TAX DUE DATES

January 15, 2024*	Summer 2nd Installment and Winter Tax Payments Due
February 29, 2024	Final Tax Year 2023 Payment Due
March 1, 2024	Unpaid 2023 real property taxes become delinquent and are transferred to Wayne County Treasurer's Office

^{*}Pay by this date to avoid interest and penalties.

LAND VALUE TAX PLAN





Here's how to use the Estimator Tool to see your Tax Savings

- Visit detroitmi.gov and click on "Land Value Tax Plan"
- 2 Cilck on "USE THE ESTIMATOR!"
- In ESTIMATOR TOOL type in Address or Parcel Number, and select the correct search result
- See your assessed and taxable values and estimated tax cut based on Land Value Tax Plan







17% AVERAGE PROPERTY TAX CUT

97% DETROIT HOMEOWNERS WILL HAVE A PROPERTY TAX CUT

- If you own a side lot (up to 4), Urban Farm or Community Garden, the Land Value Tax will not increase your taxes
- Taxes will be increased for Abandoned Buildings, Scrapyards and Parking Lot owners

Let Detroit Voters Decide

Detroiters could vote in November 2024 and get their tax cut in 2025.
